- Fidyah: Religious donations made in Islam when a fast (notably in Ramadan) is broken
- Fiqh : A Knowledge of Shariah
- Fisabillillah: For the cause of Allah
- Gharimin: Those who are in Debt
- Hadith : The Traditions of the Holy Prophet (ﷺ)
- Halal : Lawful
- Haqq : Right, Truth
- Haram : Forbidden
