There are also files and note-books, 'Council notes'; 'draft resolution for Scheduled Castes' Federation'; correspondence with the Indian Institute of International Affairs, New Delhi; correspondence with the members of the Cabinet Mission and with Prime Minister, Atlee, Mr. Churchill and other Conservative M.Ps (copies of letters and cables); notes (elaborate) on Hindu Code Bill; the constitution and standing orders of the Labour Party (typed); correspondence between Mr. M.K.Gandhi and Mr. P.N.Rajbhoj; draft summary for the Cabinet on the proposed legislation to deal with treason and treachery (secret); five chapters (typed) dealing with the problem of democracy ending with the aims and objects of the 'Republican Party' (it is an address, he has delivered sometime in 1955); and "Ambedkar the Untouchable", an article by Blake Clark, the typed manuscript is in one of the files of the Siddharth College Library.
